## Refreshed Autistic Spectrum Disorder Strategic Action Plan – Delivery plan 2016-2020

- 1.1 The refreshed Autistic Spectrum Disorder Strategic Action Plan has been developed in response to what people with autism, their family and carers have said is important to them. We have worked with a wide range of stakeholders to identify key priority themes and actions that will make a real difference to the lives of children and adults with autism. We are committed to improving the lives of people with autism and to ensure their families and carers also receive the support they need.
- 1.2 This Delivery Plan accompanies the refreshed Strategic Action Plan and sets out how the Welsh Government will work in partnership with stakeholders to deliver the commitments we have made. We have described the outcomes we want to achieve and how we will monitor the progress being made.
- 1.3 We have already commenced delivery of some of the key commitments and many will take time to fully implement. We will be regularly monitoring and reviewing progress and will take action if progress is not satisfactory and there are gaps in the services and support available. We will publish an annual update report on the Welsh Government website.
